Pastor's Corner

The reception of Holy Communion is a sacred moment in our week or even our day. There are many things that happen but to receive God in our bodies in Holy Communion is a divine experience. Reception of Holy Communion requires a preparation.

We prepare our bodies by getting ready for Mass on Sundays, we prepare our minds by calling to mind our sins and asking for forgiveness, and we prepare our hearts by making the sacred gestures at the beginning of Mass. We prepare our minds by listening to the readings and homily, by praying the prayers in communion with those around us, and by our common postures in Mass. Now with our our thoughts and words directed to God we are drawn into the love of God as he communicates himself to us in love. Thus we respond in love by our actions of coming into Holy Communion and receiving communion by taking special care to consume the Eucharist and Precious blood in the clear view of the minister*. Now with Jesus inside us, we are drawn into a moment of prayer, either personally and/or communially in song as the congregation is consumed into the fullness of the mystical body of Christ.

This is never the end of our sacred moment but a new beginning that leads us to tell others of the mighty works of God and the way that God, Jesus Christ, has been made known to us in the breaking of the bread, revealed to us as the Lamb of God and now moves with us into the world, to bring forth his kingdom in a fuller manner through the work of our hearts and hands.
